Summer/Short-Term Research Publication Grants provide support to women scholars in all fields of study to prepare research manuscripts for publication and to independent researchers to prepare research for publication. Preference will be given to applicants whose work supports the vision of AAUW: to break through educational and economic barriers so that all women have a fair chance. \$6,000 is available for an eight-week grant period. The grants are for tenure-track, part-time, and temporary faculty, as well as new and established researchers at universities.

***Did you know?***

**AAUW's American Fellowships program has been in existence since 1888, making it the oldest noninstitutional source of graduate funding for women in the U.S.**

The primary purpose of the Postdoctoral Research Leave Fellowship is to increase the number of women in tenure-track faculty positions in all fields of study and to promote equality for women in higher education. This fellowship is designed to assist the candidate in obtaining tenure and further promotions by enabling her to spend a year pursuing independent research.

The program provides fellowships for women pursuing full-time study to complete dissertations, conducting postdoctoral research full time, or preparing research for publication for eight consecutive weeks. Award amount: \$30,000.

### **Nov 15-** [Newberry Library Fellowship](#)

Long-Term Fellowships available to postdoctoral scholars who wish to be in residence at the Newberry for periods of 4 to 12 months during the 2017-18 academic year.

Long-Term Fellowships are intended to support individual scholarly research and promote serious intellectual exchange through active participation in the Newberry's scholarly activities, including fellows' seminars and a weekly colloquium. Unless stated otherwise, Long-Term Fellowships are \$4,200/month.

### **Dec 1 -** [Smithsonian Institute](#)

The Smithsonian Fellowship is the flagship fellowship program.

These fellowships are offered to scholars wishing to conduct independent research at one or more of the Smithsonian's 19 research centers.

Fellowships for postdoctoral or senior research fellows are typically 3-12 months in length and up to \$48,000 annually with a research allowance up to \$4,000.

The John Randolph **Haynes**  
and Dora Haynes **Foundation**

### **Dec 13 -** [Haynes Foundation](#)

Up to 8 faculty fellowships of \$12,000 each are awarded yearly to regular, full-time faculty members in the social sciences at any college or university in the five county Southern California region (Los Angeles, Orange, Ventura, San Bernardino, and Riverside) on the topic of policy/history of LA/Southern California region.

The awards may be used as a faculty summer research stipend, to buy course relief or to cover other incidental research assistance and expenses (excluding equipment and hardware) which might be incurred throughout the year, or in some combination. (The awards may not be used to augment salary during the regular academic year except as an addition to sabbatical leave compensation.) Fellowships may be used as seed money to begin a research project, or as full or partial support for an ongoing project.

The foundation's program on Social Inequality supports research on the social, economic, political, and labor market consequences of rising economic inequalities in the United States. Two-year grants of up to \$150,000.
