Oct 1 – [Society for Humanities Fellowships at Cornell University](#)

Each year, the society seeks interdisciplinary research projects for residencies that reflect on the philosophical, aesthetic, political, legal, ecological, religious, and cultural Understandings of authority. The program welcomes applications from scholars and practitioners who are interested in investigating the topic from the broadest variety of international and disciplinary perspectives.

For the 2018-19 program, the society is inviting scholars to explore the ends of AUTHORITY, understood as its purposes, goals, and ideals as well as its limitations, aporias, and paradoxes. *Each fellow will receive \$50,000.* Fellows who are living outside North America are eligible for an additional \$2,000 to assist with travel costs.



Oct 5 – [Radcliffe Institute Fellowships](#) at Harvard University

The Radcliffe Institute for Advanced Study at Harvard University is accepting applications for its 2018-2019 Fellowship Program. Stipends *up to \$77,500* for 1 year with additional funds for project expenses will be awarded to individuals working in the creative arts, humanities, social sciences, natural sciences, and mathematics to pursue projects within their fields. In addition, some support for relocation expenses is provided where relevant.

In addition to the stipend, fellows receive office or studio space and access to libraries and other resources of Harvard University during the fellowship year, which runs from early September 2018 through May 31, 2019. Visual, film, and video artists may apply for either one or two semesters. In the event that they come for 1 semester, the *stipend is \$38,750.*

Radcliffe Fellows are expected to devote themselves full time to the work outlined in their proposal. Since this is a residential fellowship, fellows are expected to reside in the Boston area the fellowship period and to have their primary office at the institute to participate fully in the life of the community.

The deadline for individual applications in the creative arts, humanities, and social sciences is September 14, 2017. For applications in the natural sciences and mathematics, the deadline is October 5, 2017.

NEW! Oct 18 – Major Research Grants with the [Haynes Foundation](#)

Grants for research on major economic, social and political problems of the greater Los Angeles area. Preference is given to applied studies which, in addition to adding significantly to knowledge and understanding of issues, are judged to show promise of influencing policies and practices addressing these issues. The research project's potential for publication and its use by the community are also taken into account. Funds are restricted to: 1) Solutions-oriented social science research applicable to pressing policy issues of the LA region 2) Archival and cataloging projects important to LA, 3) Dissertation fellowships at research universities in the five-county Southern California region 4) Faculty fellowships at universities and four-year colleges in the five-county Southern California region.

NEW! Oct 27 – [Woodrow Wilson Career Enhancement Fellowships for Junior faculty](#)

The Career Enhancement Fellowship Program seeks to increase the presence of minority junior faculty members and other faculty members committed to eradicating racial disparities in core fields in the arts and humanities. The Fellowship, funded by the Andrew W. Mellon Foundation, provides each Fellow with a six-month or one-year sabbatical grant; a research, travel, or publication stipend; and participation in an annual conference/retreat. A total of 30 Fellowships are awarded each year.

A stipend of *up to \$30,000* will be sent to the institution.

A grant of *up to \$1,500* for research, travel, or publication will be sent to the Fellow.

Who should apply?

- Mellon Mays Undergraduate Fellowship Programs alumni
- Minority junior faculty: African Americans, Latinos and Latinas, Native Americans, and Native Alaskans
- Junior faculty with a demonstrated commitment to eradicating racial disparities, breaking down stereotypes, and promoting cross-racial understanding in their university communities.

Finalists will be contacted in December. Following an interview of finalists in mid-Jan, awards will be announced in mid-February.

NEW! Nov 1 – Post Ph.D. Research Grants with the [Wenner-Gren Foundation](#)

Post-Ph.D. Research Grants support individual research projects. The program contributes to the Foundation's overall mission to support basic research in anthropology and to ensure that the discipline continues to be a source of vibrant and significant work that furthers our understanding of humanity's cultural and biological origins, development, and variation.

The Foundation supports research that demonstrates a clear link to anthropological theory and debates, and promises to make a solid contribution to advancing these ideas. There is no preference for any methodology, research location, or subfield. The Foundation particularly welcomes proposals that employ a comparative perspective, can generate innovative approaches or ideas, and/or integrate two or more subfields. There is no time limit on the duration of the grant and funding may be requested to cover distinct research phases (for example, two summers) if this is part of the research design. The *maximum amount of the Post-Ph.D. Research Grant is US \$20,000.*


Nov 8 – [Henry Luce Foundation/ACLS Program in China Studies](#)

The Henry Luce Foundation/ACLS Program in China Studies, now in its sixth year, seeks to maintain the vitality of China Studies in North America through fellowships and grants designed primarily for scholars early in their careers.

Collaborative Reading-Workshop Grants: *Up to \$15K* ; workshops must be held between June 1, 2018 and Sept 2019. These grants provide support for collaborative reading of texts in a workshop format that is interdisciplinary and crosses scholarly generations. Awards for collaborative reading workshops may be used to support travel and lodging costs of participants, acquisition of materials, communications, and local arrangements.

Rolling – [Robert Wood Johnson Foundation](#)

Now accepting Letters of Intent for *Evidence for Action: Investigator-Initiated Research to Build a Culture of Health*. Evidence for Action encourages creative, rigorous research on the impact of innovative programs, policies and partnerships on health and well-being, and on novel approaches to measuring health determinants and outcomes. Grants range from \$46,000 to \$500,000. Generally, applicants can expect to be notified within 6-8 of submitting their Letters of Intent. Applicants invited to the full proposal stage will have 2 months to submit their proposal once they receive notification.
